




### The Industrial Rouge Melvindale to River Rouge



This route highlights the unique industrial history of the Rouge River. See the measure Ford Rouge Center (Ford Rouge River), pass under multiple suspension bridges, gimpse diverse wildfile and possibly pass a freighter or two. The two hour trip begins at the Kessey Feidhouse Boat Launch in Melvindale and ends on the Detroit River at the Belanger Park Boat Launch in the City of River Rouge. See kayaks are recommended due to wind and open water. Hazards include freighters, boat traffic poor water quality and limited taile-out sites due to industrial operations and armored banks. Riverside Kayak Connection offers an annual trip in partnership with Friends of the Rouge every September and con organize trips by appointment.

Commerce Court to Goody Park




The Lower Branch route highlights the Roodplain torests protected within Wayne County Parkland. Towering cottomwoods and sycamores greet you as you maneuver the narrow river. Priends of the Rouge volunteers help keep this attects of river open by removing log jams and fallen trees. Great blue herons and wood ducks are plentiful and you may gimpee an occasional mink or deer. The two hour trip starts behind 3800 Commerce Court off Michigan Avenue and ends at Coudy Park in downtown Wayne. Hazards include occasional log jams or fallen trees, and ehallow spots, especially during low water. Cannoe and keysir rentals and whattle service can be ured as a huttle.


Dearborn Paddle In and around Ford Field



Ford Field in Dearborn offers an easy jounch into a pond that connects to the Lower branch. Paddlers can head out into the Lower branch and paddle upstream and back. Heading downstream is a little more adventurous. A stretch of fast moving, shallow water starting at the covered bridge is manageable but must be walled on the return. The river is wooded and natural. Work is being done to open logams for paddling to the confluence with the Main branch where one can paddle up to the historic Ford Earlate waterial or down along the concrete channel. Hazards include logarms and the waterfall. Cance and knyak rentals and shuttle services be arranged with Heaven Cance Rental. Paddlers looking to combine their trip with dining, shopping or other entertainment will find Dearborn to be easily walkable, or can use the Michigan Arenue SMART bus as a shuttle.
