

Each share a set of


- -Access Points

Trip #1: Lansing's Old Town to Delta Mills

Maps 4b, 5a, 5b (2 to 3 hours, 6.75 miles)
Park on the south side of East Grand River
Avenue in the large city-owned lot next to
Burchard Park, just downstream of the North
Lansing Dam and Brenke fish Ladder. Carry
your boat down the wooden stairs to the river.
The stairs and rocks at the launch site are
slippery and rough. Do not paddle upstream
toward the dam due to its powerful reverse
current!

The first bridge is North Grand River Avenue near the Turner-Dodge Mansion on the right.

The second bridge is M-99/Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd.

The third bridge is an old railroad trestle. It occasionally traps fallen trees, so look for the most open route underneath it.

The fourth bridge is Waverly Road.

The fifth bridge is Webster Road. After a long stretch of wooded riverbanks, look for it just downstream of an island and a small rapid that you can easily paddle through. Be ready to make a sharp left turn just past this bridge to stop at Delta Mills Park and end your trip.

Delta Mills Park has picnic tables and the sports field from the boat landing. Limited parking is available at the launch site for spotting your vehicle. Ample parking is available across the street.

Trip #2: Delta Mills to Grand Ledge Maps 5b, 6a (1.5 to 2.5 hours, 6.15 miles)

See Trip #1 above for put-in information. The only bridge between Delta Mills Park and the Jaycee Park take-out is a triple

overpass for I-69/I-96.

As you reach the outskirts of Grand Ledge, you will start to see more homes along the riverbank. The river has become the backwaters of the Grand Ledge Dam and the current is very slow.

Watch for the boat launch ramp on the left at Jaycee Park. There's a brown and white building up the hill from the river, a primitive restroom, and a playground nearby.

Some paddlers continue downstream through Grand Ledge all the way to the take-out next to the Grand Ledge Dam. This is not recommended for recreational paddlers due to the high elevation of the dock on the left and its close proximity to the dam. If you miss the dock, you may get swept over the dam. The reverse current below the dam is extremely dangerous, Jaycee Park is a much safer place to exit the river.

Trip #3: Old Town to Grand Ledge Maps 4b, 5a, 5b, 6a

(3.5 to 5 hours, 12.9 miles)

Trip #1 and Trip #2 may be combined for one longer trip.

The hotel was on the east side of River Street on the south side of the Grand River. It was closer to a sanitarium than a traditional hotel, and frequented by people who came to experience the mineral water (which had been discovered while drilling for salt), which was known to treat various diseases.







What's it Cost?

- The App was programmed by a graduate level GIS class at MSU
- It needed significant revision
- The GIS is hosted by the Institute of Water Research at MSU about \$10,000 over 2 years
- Cost of volunteer labor is free. If it had been contracted to a consultant, it probably would have been over \$50,000
- Printing only 100 copies cost \$1500
- We had grant assistance for these costs







How to Cover the Cost in the Future

- Don't know
- Questionable Possibilities:
 - Find a benefactor
 - Hope for grants
 - Solicit donations from users
- Collaborate with other Heritage Water Trails
 - The App can add points anywhere in the world
 - Sharing the GIS hosting and App support with 3 or 4 other HWTs would bring the annual cost down to ~\$500








